

Stormwater Permits Evolving Program

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Centralization

- All site-specific permits written in central office
- My unit writes industrial, including CAFO
- May see some changes as we try to bring consistency to stormwater permits



Stormwater Permits

- All stormwater permits contain basic Stormwater Prevention Pollution Plan (SWPPP) requirements
- Each SWPPP should be site-specific but must contain some minimum elements

SWPPP

- A listing of specific BMPs (min. BMPs specified in permit, should also be site-specific)
- A schedule for regular site inspections and brief written reports. Inspection reports must be kept on site with the SWPPP
- Designate an individual responsible for environmental matters.
- Train all personnel involved in material handling and storage, and housekeeping of maintenance and cleaning areas.

Stormwater Benchmarks

- When used in a permit it is a quantifiable target used to assess progress toward a numeric goal for BMP implementation.
- When not met, the permittee should take corrective action to improve progress toward meeting goal.
- Adaptive management aid that does not lead directly to enforcement

Benchmark eligible discharges

- Stormwater only
- In compliance with current permit
- In compliance with proposed benchmarks
- Dependent on receiving stream conditions

No Exposure

- All industrial materials and activities are protected from precipitation and runoff
 - Everything inside a storm resistant shelter
 - Regional Office Inspection
 - Signed certification issued by Regions
- 10 CSR 20-6.200(B)16.

No exposure (continued)

- Not all materials and activities require storm resistant shelter
 - Tightly sealed containers
 - Adequately maintained vehicles
 - Final products that would not be mobilized by stormwater

No exposure (continued)

- New facilities cannot receive no exposure certificate until construction is complete and inspection is conducted
- Facilities with process water discharges may not be eligible
 - Can maintain a simple SWPPP documenting that all materials will be protected from precipitation and runoff in a storm resistant shelter

Natural Resources

General Permits

- One master general written in central office
- Individual permits issued by regional office
- Aside from the certification page they are exactly the same
- Majority issued are Land Disturbance \$300

- Most others are \$150 annually

Implementation Plans

- EPA is promulgating rule
- July 2014 mandatory for Majors
- July 2015 mandatory for all municipal
- July 2016 mandatory for non-municipal
- Dec. 2018 mandatory for all GPs

Natural Resources

House Bill 28

- Any point source that constructs an earthen storage structure for domestic, agricultural, or industrial process wastewater to obtain a construction permit. All other constructionrelated activities are exempt
- Working on adopting in rule
- It is your P.E.'s responsibility to build to design guidelines and meet limits
